In addition, in Seychelles, the constituent entities have been granted an International Trade License under the International Business Licence Companies Act 1994 ("IBCA") and under the International Trade Zone Act 1995 ("ITZA"). Under the IBCA and ITZA, trade and business taxes are exempted. This results in no tax paid in Seychelles.
